SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Contract for Electric Service Embodying Departure from Normal Line Extension Rule.

WHEREAS: THE CALIFORNIA OREGON POWER COMPANY, by letter dated August 31, 1955, having requested authority to enter into and carry out the terms of a written contract designated as Contract No. D-75, dated August 18, 1955 with The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, to provide electric service to said customer's microwave radio relay station near McCloud, Siskiyou County, and,

WHEREAS: The terms of said contract depart from the provisions of the company's filed Rule and Regulation No. 20, Line Extensions, which requires authorization by the Commission under Section 532 of the Public Utilities Code, and,


It appearing that authorization of the aforesaid Contract No. D-75 is justified, and good cause appearing, therefore;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that The California Oregon Power Company be and it is authorized under Section 532 of the Public Utilities Code of the State of California to carry out the terms and conditions of the written contract, designated Contract No. D-75, dated August 18, 1955, with The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, and to render the service described therein under the terms, charges and conditions stated therein.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the contract herein authorized shall be marked to show that such contract was authorized under Resolution No. E-911 of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.
