SUBJECT: Permission to Occupy Both Sides of a Thoroughfare with Class "H" Lines

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, by letter dated October 30, 1956, requested authorization to occupy both sides of Fourth Avenue, 2 miles southeast of Corcoran, Kings County, with Class "H" circuits for a total distance of 33,976 feet, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission, this occupancy would constitute a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: THE CENTRAL CALIFORNIA TELEPHONE COMPANY, by letter dated October 3, 1956, states that this occupancy is agreeable providing that space will available for their future use.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be granted Pacific Gas and Electric Company to occupy with Class "H" circuits both sides of Fourth Avenue, 2 miles southeast of Corcoran, Kings County, commencing at the southerly point of termination for occupancy of Fourth Avenue with Class "H" circuits as contained in the authorization granted by the Commission to Pacific Gas and Electric Company by Resolution E-677, dated November 1, 1949, and thence continuing southerly for 31,712 feet more or less, and commencing at a point 35,997 feet more or less distant from the southerly point of termination as authorized under the aforementioned Resolution No. E-677, and thence continuing southerly for a distance of 2,266 feet more or less providing that there is space available for the Central California Telephone Company's use on the existing 12 kv and also providing that space will be available for their future use on the proposed extension.

The secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given the Pacific Gas and Electric Company of the granting of this authorization.
