SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Revisions in Tariff Schedules on Less than Statutory Notice

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC CONPANY, by Advice No. 153-E, filed December 19, 1956, having requested authority to make revisions in its teriff schedules as designated in General Service Schedules A-3 to A-6, A-10, and A-11; Domestic Service Schedules D-3 to D-6, D-10 to D-12, DA-3, DA-4, DM-2; Index of Cities; Index and Description of Special Rate Areas, set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 2768-E through 2822-E, together with Table of Contents, set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 2823-E through 2825-E, to become effective for meter readings taken on and after January 1, 1957, which is on less than 30 days' notice, and

WHEREAS: Said revisions constitute a decrease in rates effected by certain annexations of unincorporated areas, the enlargement of 19 existing Special Rate Areas, the establishment of six new Special Rate Areas, and the incorporation of two cities, and good cause appearing, therefore.

IT IS HEREBY GROEAED that suthority be greated under Section 451 of the Public Utilities Code to make the above mentioned tariff sheets effective for meter readings taken on and after January 1, 1957.

IT IS FURTHER DEDERED that the tariff sheets herein authorized shall be marked to show that such sheets were issued under Resolution No. 2-946 of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.
