SUBJECT: Permission to Geoupy Both Sides of Thoroughfare with Class "A" Lines per hule 31.3 of G.O. No. 95

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY has, by letters dated May 8, 1958 and June 12, 1958, requested sutherization to occupy with Class "He circuits both sides of Sixth Avenue between Pueblo Avenue near Cordoran and Angiola Substation in Sings County, for a distance of 32,970 feet, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of Commission permission, such occupancy would constitute a violation of Bule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WEBBAS: The Central California Telephone Company, the communication utility in the area, by letter of May 27, 1953, has indicated no objection to the promosed occupancy.

IT IS FOUND that the requested permission should be granted the Facific Cas and Electric Company, and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEADEN ORDERED that permission be granted the Pacific Gas and Electric Company under the provisions of Rule No. 31.3 of General Order No. 95 to occupy with Class "H" lines both sides of Sixth Avenue between Pueblo Avenue, near Corcoren, and Angiola Substation in Mings County. for a distance of 32,970 feet, substantially as shown on the drawing marked Loc. Not. No 9848 ON submitted with the company's letter of May 8, 1958.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given the Pacific Gas and Electric Company of the granting of this authorizetion.
