WHEREAS: THE PAGIFIC TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY, the only other pole using utility in the area, by letter of January 21, 1959, has indicated no objection to the proposed occupancy,

IT IS FOUND that the requested permission should be granted the PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC CARPANT, and good cause appearing

IT IS HERRET ORDERED that permission be granted the PAGIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC GOMPANY under the provisions of Rule No. 31.3 of General Order No. 95 to continue to occupy with Class "H" circuits both sides of Millow Avenue between Copper and Shepherd Avenues, near Clovis, Presmo County for a distance of 10,625 feet, more or less, substantially as shown on the Drawing marked 5-37245 submitted with the company's letter of February 10, 1959.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given the Pacific Gas and Electric Company of the granting of this authorization.
