SUBJECT: **Permission to Occupy Both Sides of Thoroughfare with Class "H" Lines per Rule 31.3 of G.O. No. 95**

WHEREAS: **PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY** has, by letter dated March 20, 1959, requested authorization to occupy with Class "H" circuits both sides of Avenue 12 between Madera Avenue and Road 26- $\frac{1}{2}$ near Madera, Madera County for a distance of 2567 feet, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of Commission permission, such occupancy would constitute a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95 and

WHEREAS: **THE PACIFIC TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY**, the only other pole using utility in the area, by letter of March 5, 1959, has indicated no objection to the proposed occupancy,

IT IS FOUND that the requested permission should be granted the Pacific Gas and Electric Company, and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be granted the Pacific Gas and Electric Company under the provisions of Rule No. 31.3 of General Order No. 95 to occupy with Class "H" circuits both sides of Avenue 12, between Madera Avenue and Road 26- $\frac{1}{2}$, near Madera, Madera County, for a distance of 2567 feet, substantially as shown on the drawing marked M-15022 submitted with the Company's letter of March 20, 1959, provided that poles set in this section include space for the telephone company's future use.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given the Pacific Gas and Electric Company of the granting of this authorization.
