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SUBJECT: Request for Permission to Deviate from Rule III (c) of G.O. No. 52 Regarding Transposition of Power Circuits.

WHEREAS:PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, by letter dettd April 27, 1959, has requested authorization to deviate from Rule III (e) of General Order No. 52 relating to the operation of power and communication lines for the prevention or mitigation of inductive interference, by omitting transpositions in its proposed twin circuit 110 ky line between El Patio Substation and Station "A" Substation in its San Jose Division and

WHEREAS: The proposed construction is 3.8 miles in length (Rule III (c) exempts the requirement to transpose for power circuits of less than 3 miles in length) and in the absence of Commission authorization would constitute a violation of the General Order and

WHEREAS: The MESTERN UNION TELEGRAPH COMPANY, the SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY and THE PACIFIC TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY which are involved in various crossings and random parallels with the proposed transmission line have expressed no objections to the omission of the transpositions in this line as indicated by letters dated February 3, February 10, and March 6, 1959 respectively.

IT IS FOUND that the requested authorization should be granted the PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY and good cause appearing

IT IS MERREN ORDERED that the PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY be granted permission to deviate from the provisions RULE III (c) of General Order No. 52 to the extent that transpositions may be omitted from its twin circuit 110 ky line between El Patic Substation and Station "A" in its San Jose Division as shown under GM137360, on drawings No. 209308, 210241, 210243, 210244, 210245, 210246, 210247, 210248, 210249, and 210393 submitted with the company's letter of April 27, 1959 provided that if in the future the need for the prevention or mitigation of inductive interference should arise, PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY will cover such cost of correction.
