Accounting FileSUBJECT: **Permission to Occupy Both Sides of a Thoroughfare
with Class "H" Circuits**

WHEREAS: The SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY has, by letter dated September 4, 1959, requested authorization to occupy with Class "H" circuits, both sides of streets in the West Covina area of Los Angeles County, starting on Stinson Avenue at the Union Pacific tracks and going northeast to Fourth Street; north on Fourth Street to Hill Street, east on Hill Street to Del Valle Street; north on Del Valle Street to Amar Road; east on Amar Road to Aileron Avenue; north on Aileron Avenue to Maple Grove Avenue; east on Maple Grove Avenue to Walnut Avenue; north on Walnut Avenue to Francisquito Avenue; east on Francisquito Avenue to Azusa Avenue, where it terminates at a substation, a distance of approximately 26,300 feet, and

WHEREAS: Permission for such occupancy is required by Rule No. 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: The General Telephone Company, the communication utility along these streets, has by letter dated September 1, 1959, stated that it has no objection to the proposed parallel of their lines,

IT IS FOUND that the requested permission should be granted and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be granted the SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY under the provisions of Rule No. 31.3 of General Order No. 95 to occupy with Class "H" circuits, both sides of streets in the West Covina area of Los Angeles County, starting on Stinson Avenue at the Union Pacific tracks and going northeast to Fourth Street; north on Fourth Street to Hill Street; east on Hill Street to Del Valle Street; north on Del Valle Street to Amar Road; east on Amar Road to Aileron Avenue; north on Aileron Avenue to Maple Grove Avenue; east on Maple Grove Avenue to Walnut Avenue; north on Walnut Avenue to Francisquito Avenue; east on Francisquito Avenue to Azusa Avenue, where it terminates at a substation, a distance of approximately 26,300 feet, as shown on Drawing No. 600-1 dated June 24, 1959, submitted with the utility's letter of September 4, 1959.
