SUBJECT: Permission to Occupy Both Sides of a Thoroughfare
with Class "H" Circuits

WHEREAS: The SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY has, by letter dated September 15, 1959, requested authorization to occupy with Class "H" circuits both sides of Lomita Boulevard, in the City of Torrance, and

WHEREAS: Permission for such occupancy is required by Rule No. 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and


WHEREAS: The General Telephone Company a communication utility along this street has, by letter dated September 8, 1959, stated that it has no objection to the proposed parallel; and The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company another communication utility along this street has, by letter dated August 18, 1959, stated that it has no objection to the proposed parallel provided the line voltage on the pole line now jointly used will be limited to 16.5 kv,

IT IS FOUND that the requested permission should be granted and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be granted SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY, under the provisions of Rule No. 31.3 of General Order No. 95, to occupy with Class "H" circuits both sides of Lomita Boulevard, in the City of Torrance, starting at Pennsylvania Avenue and going northwest to Hawthorne Avenue, a distance of approximately 8,640 feet, as shown on Southern California Edison Company Drawing No. 603, W.O. 4405-1792, dated August 3, 1959, provided the line voltage on the pole line now jointly used will be limited to 16.5 kv.
