SUBJECT: CP National Order Authorizing Energy Rate Adjustments to Increase Annual Revenues for All Electric Districts

CP National (CPN), by Advice Letters Nos. 217-E (Lassen), 216-E (Weaverville), and 215-E (Needles) filed May 12, 1981 requests authority to increase its Energy Rates. These increases are composed of two components; one is to offset periodic increases in rates charged to CPN for purchased power, and the other is to amortize the under-collections which have accumulated in CPN's-Purchased Power Cost Balancing Account. There are no changes in Base Rates. The proposed annual revenue increase, the resulting domestic Energy Rates and the present and proposed domestic Base plus Energy Rates are shown in the following table:

These filings comply with procedures contained in Parts D and F of CPN's Preliminary Statement.

The requested increases are being distributed on a uniform \$\(\ext{kWh} \) basis to each class of customer (1.030 \$\(\ext{kWh} \) for Lassen, 1.209 \$\(\ext{kWh} \) for Weaverville and 1.569 \$\(\ext{kWh} \) for Needles). However, within the residential class this average increase is being allocated between lifeline and non-lifeline rates so that the ratio of the non-lifeline total rate remains at the present differential of 1.35 for Lassen and Weaverville, and 1.40 for Needles.

The present and proposed domestic rates and the effect of these rates on winter and summer bills are shown in the following table:

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The larger increase for the Needles District is explained by (a) A substantial increase in the fuel cost adjustment charges paid to Nevada Power Company; (b) A larger portion of total electric sales falling within the lifeline allowance; (c) No change in energy rates has been made in Needles since September, 1979. The last increase for the Lassen and Weaverville Districts was July 29, 1980.

Such changes are hereby found to be just and reasonable; therefore, good cause appearing:

IT IS ORDERED that California PUC Sheets Nos. 1375-E through 1410-E be marked to show that such sheets were issued under Resolution No. E-1925 of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California to become effective June 16, 1981. The effective date is the date hereof.
