**SUBJECT:** Bay Point Light & Power Company. Order Authorizing  
Tariff Filing for Purchased Power Adjustment to  
Increase Annual Revenue by \$114,400 or 18.7%

BAY POINT LIGHT & POWER COMPANY, of Concord, by Advice Letter No. 104-E, filed July 12, 1982, requests authority to increase its Purchased Power Adjustment Clause rate effective August 1, 1982, or as soon as possible thereafter.

The proposed revenue increase and resulting Purchased Power Adjustment factors are shown in the following table:

The proposed increase results from increases by Pacific Gas and Electric Company in the fuel cost adjustment effective May 1, 1982, and increased base rates effective January 1, 1982, under wholesale tariffs subject to the jurisdiction of the FERC. The proposed increase also includes amortization of undercollections in the PPA balancing account over 12 months. The most recent prior increase in the PPA was effective September 3, 1980.

For ease of administration of the PPA, it is important that this filing become effective on the first of a month.

By letter dated April 1, 1982, each customer was notified of a pending increase and the reasons for it. The Commission has received one related protest.

This rate increase is found to be reasonable and necessary to enable the utility to track increases in rates by its supplier; therefore, good cause appearing,


IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Authority is granted under Sections 454 and 491 of the Public Utilities Code, and under the provisions of the utility's PPA procedure in its filed tariff schedules, to place the foregoing tariff sheets into effect on August 1, 1982, which is on less than statutory notice.

2. The foregoing advice letter and tariff sheets shall be marked to show that they were authorized by Resolution No. E-1946 of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California. The effective date of this resolution is the date hereof.
