R E S O L U T I O N

SUBJECT: Order Authorizing a Second Contract Extension to be Effective on Less Than Statutory Notice.

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY by agreement of May 14, 1964 amends and extends to and including June 30, 1964 the terms and conditions of a contract dated March 6, 1964, covering resale of certain excess gas to Southern California Gas Company and Southern Counties Gas Company of California and

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY has contractual obligations to purchase from El Paso Natural Gas Company amounts of gas in excess of Pacific Gas and Electric Company's present requirements, and

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY AND SOUTHERN COUNTIES GAS COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA have the market for any such excess gas that Pacific Gas and Electric Company makes available by resale or release; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Sections 491 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to furnish the service under the conditions and in accordance with the terms and conditions of said contract and to make the contract extension effective on May 15, 1964

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the contract hereinabove authorized be marked to show that it was authorized under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1229.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Pacific Gas and Electric Company shall notify the Commission of the date of termination of said contract extension within thirty days after date of termination.
