> SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Changes in Tariff Schedules Which Will Result in Rate Increases on Less Than Statutory Notice.

WHEREAS: PACIFIC LIGHTING GAS SUPPLY COMPANY, by Advice No. 26, filed January 14, 1965, having requested authority under Sections 454, 455, and 491 of the Public Utilities Code to make effective on less than 30 days' notice, namely on January 1, 1965, an increased maximum daily delivery rate and an increased monthly demand charge to Southern California Gas Company together with reduced demand and commodity rates and other minor tariff schedule revisions as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 218-G through 222-G, inclusive, and

WHEREAS: PACIFIC LIGHTING GAS SUPPLY COMPANY requests that this filing be made effective on January 1, 1965 in order to complement Applicant's proposed refunds of Invalid Texas Gas Tax covering the period ending December 31, 1964, and

WHEREAS: There is no change in the aggregate demand charges billed by Applicant, and

WHEREAS: We find that such increases resulting from the above changes in the tariff schedules are justified; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Sections 454 and 491 of the Public Utilities Code to make said sheets effective on January 1, 1965.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above tariff sheets shall be marked to show that such sheets were issued under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1254.
