SUBJECT: Order Authorizing a Deviation from Filed Tariff
 Rules Which Result in Reduced Rates

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY by Advice Letter No. 510-G, filed March 11, 1965, having requested authority under Sections 455 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code, to apply all charges at the 900 Btu Rate Level in the Marysville-Yuba City Rate Area, which is served gas both at the 900 and 950 Btu Rate Levels, and thereby deviate from Rule 2(c) of the effective schedules, with a resultant rate reduction for customers served 950 Btu gas, as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheet No. 7602-G, and

WHEREAS: The utility asserts that it is presently impracticable to isolate each of the several sources of supply to fixed areas within the rate area, and

WHEREAS: The utility is currently taking steps to supply the entire rate area with natural gas at a uniform heat content, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Section 532 of the Public Utilities Code for the utility to charge effective rates at the 900 Btu Rate Level in the Marysville-Yuba City Rate Area until such time that the utility is able to supply natural gas to the entire rate area at a uniform heating value.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above sheet shall be marked to show that such sheet was issued under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1265.
