WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY has by letter dated April 27, 1966, requested a deviation from Section 208 of General Order No. 112-A at the request of its customer, California Ammonia Company, and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Pacific Gas and Electric Company is hereby authorized to deviate from Section 208 of General Order No. 112-A and serve unodorized gas from the McMullin Ranch Field to California Ammonia Company at its anhydrous ammonia plant near Lathrop, California.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that such deviation shall terminate upon the discontinuance of the supply of gas from McMullin Ranch Field to California Ammonia Company and that Pacific Gas and Electric Company shall notify the Commission of such discontinuance of supply.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Pacific Gas and Electric Company shall revise its list of contracts and deviations to include this deviation in accordance with General Order No. 96-A.
