SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Contracts Filed Under Section X,
Paragraph A, of General Order No. 96-A, to be Effective

on Regular Statutory Notice

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN COUNTIES GAS COMPANY, by Advice No. 517, filed June 21, 1966, having requested authority under Sections 490 and 532 of the Public. Utilities Code to make effective on regular statutory notice an agreement dated April 22, 1966, which will amend the original contract dated November 5, 1965, and allow natural gas service to Collier Carbon and Chemical Corporation under Schedule No. G-52 without standby equipment in lieu of previously approved service under Schedule No. G-51, and

WHEREAS: The supplying of interruptible natural gas service under Schedule No. G-52 without standby equipment is both a deviation from the utility's filed tariff schedules, and from Decisions Nos. 69797 and 70077, and

WHEREAS: Such deviation was previously authorized for service under Schedule No. G-51 by Decisions Nos. 69797 and 70077, dated October 19, 1965, and December 14, 1965, respectively, in Application No. 47807; therefor, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Sections 490 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to carry out the terms and conditions of this contract amendment.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that said contract amendment be marked to show that it was authorized under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1327.
