SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Deviation from a Portion of Section 5.e.1.
 of General Order No. 94-A

WHEREAS: California-Pacific Utilities Company, by letter dated June 21, 1967, having requested authority under Section 1 of General Order No. 94-A to deviate from the specified procedure required by Section 5.e.1. of this order with respect to the 20-year inspection of liquid hydrocarbon storage vessels, as outlined in said letter, and

WHEREAS: The utility has requested the use of the non-destructive reflectoscope method when examining for internal corrosion during the inspection of its liquid hydrocarbon vessels located in the towns of Yreka and Dunsmuir, and

WHEREAS: If the results of any such test indicate a vessel to be in a defective or hazardous condition, it must be removed from service, repaired and tested in accordance with General Order No. 94-A before it is again placed in service, and

WHEREAS: Such deviation will relieve the utility from unnecessary expenses, hardship, disruption of service, and, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Section 768 of the Public Utilities Code for California-Pacific Utilities Company, to carry out the inspection procedure as outlined in its letter of June 21, 1967, under the condition stated herein.
