SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Deviation From Filed Tariff Schedules for a Gas Main Extension, to be Effective on Less Than Statutory Notice

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY by Advice Letter No. 565-G, filed November 17, 1967, having requested authority under its Rule No. 15.E.7 and Sections 491 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to make effective on November 28, 1967, a deviation from its filed tariff schedules by waiving gas main extension advances for the proposed extension of natural gas service to the town of Maxwell, Colusa County, as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 8062-G through 8066-G, inclusive, and

WHEREAS: In granting the authorization requested, the Commission states that if it should appear in future proceedings that there are deficiencies in earnings from this extension, such deficiencies are not to be imposed upon the utility's other gas customers; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Sections 491 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to deviate from the provisions of Rule No. 15, Gas Main Extensions, by waiving main extension advances for this extension of natural gas to the town of Maxwell, and to make said tariff sheets effective on November 28, 1967.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above sheets be marked to show that such sheets were issued under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1403.
