**SUBJECT:** Order Authorizing Contract Filed Under Section X, Paragraph A of General Order No. 96-A to Deviate from Filed Tariff Schedules.

**WHEREAS:** SOUTHERN COUNTIES GAS COMPANY of CALIFORNIA by Advice Letter No. 581, filed August 1, 1968, having requested authority under Section X, Paragraph A, of General Order No. 96-A, and Section 532 of the Public Utilities Code to make effective on regular statutory notice a contract executed June 3, 1968, with Shell Chemical Company for interruptible gas service under Schedule No. G-52 to its anhydrous ammonia plant at Ventura, California, and

**WHEREAS:** Said contract deviates from the filed tariff schedules with respect to waiving standby requirements specified in Special Condition 2 of Schedule No. G-52 for the gas used as raw material and fuel in the production of anhydrous ammonia, and

**WHEREAS:** Shell Chemical Company states that during periods of interruption (1) no other material can be used as a standby raw material, (2) no damage to equipment or reactors will occur, (3) no employees will be laid off as a direct result of the interruption, and (4) normal product deliveries can be made from storage, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Section 532 of the Public Utilities Code to carry out the terms and conditions of this contract.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that said contract be marked to show that it was authorized under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1417.
