SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Deviations from Filed Tariffs on
Less Than Statutory Notice

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY by Advice Letter No. 582-G, filed April 1, 1969, having requested authority under its Rule No. 15.E.7 and Sections 491 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to deviate from its filed tariff schedules by waiving gas main extension advances in the extension of natural gas service to the Grass Valley - Nevada City Rate Area as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 8234-G to 8240-G, inclusive, and have such sheets become effective on April 9, 1969 which is less than statutory notice, and

WHEREAS: Special conditions which will provide adequate earnings will be agreed upon prior to commencing construction, and

WHEREAS: Such deviations from filed tariff schedules will facilitate procurement of the necessary applications for natural gas service, and

WHEREAS: The requested effective date of April 9, 1969 will allow the utility to begin procurement of the applications as early as possible, therefore good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under sections 491 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to make said tariff sheets effective on April 9, 1969.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above sheets be marked to show that such sheets were issued under resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1434.
