SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Contract Filed Under Section X,
Paragraph A of General Order No. 96-A to Deviate
from Filed Tariff Schedules

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY by Advice Letter No. 762, filed
April 25, 1969, having requested authority under Section X, Paragraph A, of
General Order No. 96-A, and Section 532 of the Public Utilities Code to make
effective on regular statutory notice a contract executed February 10, 1969,
with Castaic Clay Manufacturing Company for interruptible gas service under
Schedule No. G-50 to its brick plant near Castaic, California, and

WHEREAS: Said contract deviates from the filed tariff schedules with respect
to waiving standby requirements specified in Special Condition 2 of Schedule
No. G-50 for gas used as a fuel in Castaic Clay's scove kilns, and

WHEREAS: Castaic Clay Manufacturing Company states that during periods of
interruption (1) no damage to the equipment or the product will occur, (2)
no employees will be laid off as a direct result of the interruption, and
(3) normal product deliveries can be made from storage facilities; therefore,
good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Section 532 of the Public
Utilities Code to carry out the terms and conditions of this contract.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that said contract be marked to show that it was
authorized under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the
State of California No. G-1437.
