WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY by Advice Letter No. 769, having requested authority under Section X, Paragraph A of General Order 96-A, and Section 532 of the Public Utilities Code to make effective on regular statutory notice a contract executed July 9, 1969, with Basic Vegetable Products, Inc., for interruptible gas service under Schedule No. G-53T to a proposed new onion dehydration plant in Porterville, California, and

WHEREAS: Said contract deviates from the filed tariff schedules with respect to waiving standby requirements specified in Special Condition 2 of Schedule No. G-53T, and

WHEREAS: Basic Vegetable Products, Inc., states that they have processed and warehoused the major portion of their customers' annual requirements by October 1st of each year and that curtailment during the possible operating period of October and November would not adversely effect plant employment and equipment, product quality or product deliveries; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Section 532 of the Public Utilities Code to carry out the terms and conditions of this contract.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that said contract be marked to show that it was authorized under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1445.
