SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Changes in Tariff Schedules Which Will Result in Increased Charges

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN COUNTIES GAS COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA by Advice Letter No. 636, filed July 1, 1970, having requested authority under Sections 454 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to revise Rule No. 20, Gas Main Extensions, and Rule No. 21, Gas Service Extensions, by increasing charges for excess gas pipe footage, as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 5434-G to 5437-G, inclusive, and

WHEREAS: Said Rule No. 20 provides for the revision of the main unit charges when unit installation costs have changed by more than 10% and the proposed unit charge for mains based on 1969 construction costs, exceed the costs now on file, and

WHEREAS: The service unit costs have not changed by more than 10%, but increased service unit costs are proposed for facilitation of the merger authorized by Decision No. 77010 in Application No. 51567, and

WHEREAS: The revision of these unit charges is being accomplished in accordance with the procedure authorized by Ordering Paragraph 5 of Decision No. 59801, dated March 22, 1960, in Case No. 5945, and

WHEREAS: We find that the increases are justified; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Sections 454 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to make said sheets effective on July 31, 1970.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above sheets be marked to show that such sheets were issued under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1493.
