SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Rate Increase that Deviates from Filed Tariffs

WHEREAS: SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY by Advice Letter No. 78-H, filed August 31, 1973, requests authority under Sections 454 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to increase the fuel cost adjustment billing factor in Special Condition 4 of Schedule 1 as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 261-H and 262-H, and deviate from the formula prescribed therein, and

WHEREAS: The \$4,000 revenue increase requested will substitute a positive 4 cents per 1,000 lbs. billing factor for the negative 2 cents per 1,000 lbs., previously approved by the Commission in Resolution No. G-1590, and

WHEREAS: The reason for the deviation requested is to attempt to avoid the utility's rate of return exceeding the 8.0% previously authorized by the Commission and is based on the utility's review of more recorded data available since the last filing, and

WHEREAS: This situation has arisen due to the utility's requirement to burn fuels that meet with current emission control standards of the San Diego Air Pollution Control District, and

WHEREAS: We find the increase embodied in this filing to be justified; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Sections 454 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to make the above sheets effective for service rendered on and after October 1, 1973.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above sheets be marked to show that they were issued under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1593.
