SUBJECT: Order Authorizing GEDA Increases in Gas Tariff Schedules on less than Statutory Notice

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY by Advice Letter No. 900, filed September 4, 1974 requests authority under Sections 454, 491 and 701 of the Public Utilities Code to increase rates under the GEDA procedure prescribed by Decision No. 81898 in Application No. 53625 as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 13964-G to 13979-G, inclusive, to become effective on October 1, 1974 which constitutes less than statutory notice, and

WHEREAS: The rate adjustment reflects the total of the gas exploration costs for GEDA Projects Nos. 74-E, 74-F and 74-G previously approved by Resolutions Nos. G-1655, G-1665 and G-1666, respectively, and

WHEREAS: It is proposed to increase existing tariffs by a total of 0.012 cents per therm resulting in an addition to current annual revenues of approximately \$963,000, and

WHEREAS: Short notice authorization is requested in order that the utility may begin recovery during the fourth quarter of 1974 for costs it is currently experiencing for those GEDA projects, and

WHEREAS: We find these increases justified; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Sections 454, 491 and 701 of the Public Utilities Code and in accordance with Decision No. 81898 to make the above sheets effective on October 1, 1974.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above sheets be marked to show that they were issued under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1671.
