SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Changes in Gas Tariff Schedules Which Will Result in Increased Charges on Less Than Statutory Notice

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY by Advice No. 904, filed November 14, 1974, requests authority under Sections 454, 491 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to amend Schedule No. G-60, Wholesale Natural Gas Service and to file the Twelfth Supplemental Service Agreement between the utility and the City of Long Beach as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 14005-G to 14011-G, inclusive to provide for increases in Long Beach's daily contract demand from 68,000 to 70,000 Mcf per day, and additional peaking demand from 21,000 to 22,000 Mcf per day, and

WHEREAS: Long Beach requested these increased quantities in order to meet anticipated requirements on its system, and

WHEREAS: By Resolution No. C-21774, dated November 12, 1974, the City of Long Beach authorized the City Manager to execute this Twelfth Service Agreement with Southern California Gas Company, and

WHEREAS: The requested effective date of December 1, 1974 coincides with the anniversary date of the Long Beach Service Agreement, and

WHEREAS: We find these increases are justified; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Sections 454, 491 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to make said sheets effective as of December 1, 1974.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above sheets be marked to show that they were issued under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1696.
