SUBJECT: Order Rejecting Rate Increase

WHEREAS: SAN DIEGO GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 89-H, filed July 1, 1975, requests authority to increase its steam tariff rates, as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 293-H thru 295-H, inclusive, in accordance with the procedure provided for in Section 7. of the Preliminary Statement, and

WHEREAS: The total net revenue effect of this requested filing will mean approximately \$162,000 annual increase for the utility's Steam Department, and

WHEREAS: The requested increase is based on a system-wide average fuel cost estimated by the utility of 215.39 cents per M² Btu for San Diego's Electric Department, and

WHEREAS: San Diego currently has pending before the Commission, Application No. 55774 for an Electric Department fuel cost adjustment increase, and

WHEREAS: It is the staff's recommended procedure to base steam fuel cost adjustments on the same basis as the latest approved electric fuel cost adjustment factor, and

WHEREAS: It is expected that a Decision will be issued in the near future on Application No. 55774, which will determine electric system fuel costs; therefore good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED the tariff sheets submitted herewith be rejected and that the Commission will give consideration to a subsequent steam fuel cost adjustment filing, with such filing to be contingent upon a Decision in Application No. 55775.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that these tariff sheets be marked to show that they were rejected under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1782.
