> SUBJECT: Request by Walter Carpet Mills for Delay in P4 Boiler Classification

WHEREAS: WALTER CARPET MILLS, by letter dated April 12, 1976, having requested Commission authorization to delay Priority P4 classification of their industrial boilers from July 30, 1976 to May 1, 1977, and

WHEREAS: The present boilers are inadequate to supply the process steam vital to the company's operation when fired by oil, and

WHEREAS: The company is making every effort to install an adequate, efficient oil firing capability, and

WHEREAS: This effort must result in the correct course of action and will take time, and

WHEREAS: This plant provides employment for 750 people; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Walter Carpet Mills' industrial boilers be classified under the provisions of Decision No. 85189 in Priority 2A (temporary) until May 1, 1977, at which time they will be classified Priority P4.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Southern California Gas Company be informed of this decision and that the utility be instructed to continue service to Walter Carpet Mills, as a priority 2A (temporary) until May 1, 1977. The effective date of this resolution is the date hereof.
