SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Revision in Tariff Rules Which Will
Result in Increased Revenue Without Increased Rates

WHEREAS: SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 364-G, filed July 28, 1976, having requested authority under Section VI of General Order No. 96-A, to make revisions in Rule No. 2, Description of Service, as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 2094-G to 2096-G, inclusive, and

WHEREAS: The proposed revision consists of adding a statement which would allow for corrections for any deviation from Boyle's Law due to the super-compressibility effect on high pressure gas metering, and

WHEREAS: This filing will affect the quantity of gas sold and thus increase the utility's net revenue by approximately \$86,000 per year without increasing any rates, and

WHEREAS: We find that this rule revision will result in a more accurate measurement of actual gas consumption and will reduce unaccounted for figures; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that authority be granted under Section VI of General Order No. 96-A to make the above tariff sheets effective on August 27, 1976.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above tariff sheets be marked to show that they were accepted for filing under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1937. The effective date of this resolution is the date hereof.
