SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Increase for Steam Tariff Rates

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 47-S, filed July 28, 1976, requests authority to increase its steam tariff rates, as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 201-H and 202-H, in accordance with the procedure provided in Section 7 of the Preliminary Statement, and

WHEREAS: The total net revenue effect of this request filing will result in approximately \$9,100, or 0.3%, increase for the utility's Steam Department, and

WHEREAS: The fuel cost adjustment factor is changed from \$0.402 per 1,000 pounds of steam to \$0.413 per 1,000 pounds of steam, and

WHEREAS: The Company, in the past, used approximately 98.8% of natural gas and 1.2% fuel oil as its energy sources for steam, will now use 100% natural gas; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that PG&E be authorized to place into effect a revised steam fuel cost adjustment factor, effective August 27, 1976, which constitutes regular statutory notice.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above advice letter be marked to show that it was authorized under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-1938. The effective date of this resolution is the date hereof.
