R E S O L U T I O N

SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Revision of Filed Steam Tariffs
Resulting in Rate Increase

WHEREAS: SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 95-H, filed January 28, 1977, requests authority to revise the Preliminary Statement of its filed Steam Tariff Schedules to withdraw the present Fuel Cost Adjustment (FCA) provision and replace it with an Energy Cost Adjustment Clause (ECAC) as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 311-H to 318-H, inclusive, and resulting in the following:

1. The ECAC that the utility is proposing is similar to the ECAC that is presently in effect for the utility's Electric Department.
2. Special Condition 4 of the utility's Steam Rate Schedules 1 and 2 are revised to reflect the proposed ECAC provision and its corresponding ECAC adjustment rates.
3. The revision dates for future ECAC adjustment rates will occur on January 1, and July 1 of each year.
4. The proposed Steam ECAC adjustment rates for Rate Schedules 1 and 2 are \$1.19 per M lbs. and \$1.21 per M lbs. of steam, respectively, resulting in a rate increase over the respective FCA billing factors of \$0.82 per M lbs. and \$0.83 per M lbs. of steam.
5. The total net revenue effect of this filing will result in an annual revenue increase of \$89,500, or 4.7%, for the utility's Steam Department.
6. This rate schedule revision and resultant rate increase is found to be reasonable; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Authority be granted under Sections 454 and 701 of the Public Utilities Code for SDG&E to place the above filing into effect this date, which constitutes regular statutory notice.
2. The above tariff sheets be marked to show that they were authorized under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-2044. The effective date of this Resolution is the date hereof.
