SUBJECT: Request to Provide Additional Natural Gas Service  
In Excess of 50 Mcfd

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 878-G, filed February 16, 1977, having requested Commission approval under the provisions of Decision No. 85189, to supply additional natural gas in excess of 50 Mcfd to Crown Zellerbach Corp. (Applicant), in San Leandro, Alameda County, with the following provisions:

1. Applicant's request is for an additional average daily consumption of 6 Mcf, raising his existing average daily consumption from 54.8 Mcf to 60.8 Mcf.

2. Applicant will use this additional gas to operate a direct-fired dryer in the manufacture of flexible packaging material used to wrap food for human consumption.

3. Fuel oil cannot be used in this direct-fired process since the products of combustion impinge on the packaging material which in turn would contaminate the food products the packaging is supposed to protect.

4. We find that this Applicant will be classified in Priority 1 under the end use criteria adopted in Decision No. 85189; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Authority be granted under the provisions of Decision No. 85189 for PG&E to supply the requested service to Crown Zellerbach Corp. effective March 18, 1977, which constitutes regular statutory notice.

2. The above advice letter and application be marked to show that they were issued under resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-2050. The effective date of this resolution is the date hereof.
