RESOLUTION

SUBJECT: Request to Provide Additional Natural Gas Service
In Excess of 50 Mcfd

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 1049, filed February 17, 1977, having requested Commission approval under the provisions of Decision No. 85189, to supply additional natural gas in excess of 50 Mcfd to Bourns, Inc. (Applicant) in Riverside, Riverside County with the following provisions:

1. Applicant's request is for an additional peak day consumption of 28 Mcf raising his existing peak day consumption from 39 Mcf to 67 Mcf.
2. Applicant will use this additional gas to operate a direct fired tunnel kiln for vitrification of small electronic ceramic components.
3. Use of an alternate fuel is not feasible due to the critical temperature control required in the process.
4. Solar heated equipment is not available for vitrification of these ceramic components.
5. We find that this Applicant will be classified in Priority 1 under the end use criteria adopted in Decision No. 85189; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Authority be granted under the provisions of Decision No. 85189 for Southern California Gas Company to supply the requested service to Bourns, Inc. effective March 29, 1977, which constitutes regular statutory notice.
2. The above advice letter be marked to show that it was authorized by Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-2060. The effective date of this resolution is the date hereof.
