RESOLUTION

SUBJECT: Request to Provide Natural Gas Service In Excess of 50 Mcfd

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 1056, filed March 22, 1977, having requested Commission approval under the provisions of Decision No. 85189, to supply natural gas in excess of 50 Mcfd to Sierra Alloys Company (Applicant) in Duarte, Los Angeles County with the following provisions:

1. Applicant's request is for an average daily consumption of 181 Mcf.
2. Applicant will use this gas to operate three heat treating furnances to produce special alloys used in the aerospace and nuclear industries.
3. Fuel oil cannot be used to fire this equipment due to temperature control limitations and adverse metallurgical effects produced by fuel oil combustion.
4. Solar energy technology is not sufficiently advanced to have application in this 24 hour per day, sophisticated, metallurgical operation.
5. We find that this request should be granted and that Applicant should be classified in Priority 2 under the end-use criteria adopted in Decision No. 85189; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Authority be granted under the provisions of Decision No. 85189 for Southern California Gas Company to supply the requested service to Sierra Alloys Company effective April 21, 1977.
2. The above advice letter be marked to show that it was authorized under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-2065. The effective date of this resolution is the date hereof.
