SUBJECT: Order Authorizing PGA Rate Increase on Less than Statutory Notice

WHEREAS: SOUTHWEST GAS CORPORATION, by Advice Letter No. 183, filed April 7, 1977, having requested authority under the PGA clauses of its filed tariff schedules to file revised tariff sheets, applicable to its San Bernardino County rate area, in order to track a rate increase by its supplier, PG&E, as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 1441-G to 1449-G, inclusive, under the following conditions:

1. The proposed annual revenue revision of \$560,450 will offset the proposed rate revisions by PG&E.
2. An effective date on less than statutory notice is requested to coincide with the effective date of any tariff sheets filed by PG&E pursuant to a decision granted in Application No. 56393.
3. In the event the Commission requires PG&E to file different rate schedules than anticipated, SoWest will file substitute tariff sheets to reflect approved rate levels.
4. We find this requested rate increase to be reasonable; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Authority be granted under Sections 454, 491 and 701 of the Public Utilities Code, and under the provisions of the utility's filed PGA clauses, to place the above tariff sheets or subsequent substitute tariff sheets into effect on a date concurrent with the effective date of PG&E's approved rate increase in Application No. 56393.
2. The above tariff sheets and/or any subsequent substitute tariff sheets be marked to show that they were issued under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-2071. The effective date of this Resolution is the date hereof.
