SUBJECT: Request to Provide Additional Natural Gas Service In Excess of 50 Mcfd

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 1075, filed May 16, 1977, has requested Commission approval under the provisions of Decision No. 85189, to supply additional natural gas in excess of 50 Mcfd to The Raymond Company (Applicant) in San Fernando, Los Angeles County, under the following circumstances:

1. Applicant's request is for an additional average daily consumption of 40 Mcf, raising his existing average daily consumption from 70 Mcf to 110 Mcf.
2. Applicant will use this additional gas to operate 2 additional kilns for the production of glazed ceramic white-ware.
3. Fuel oil cannot be used in this operation because it would cause discoloration of the product and sulfur contaminates the surface glaze.
4. Alternate fuel would produce commercially unacceptable products.
5. Solar equipment is not capable of attaining and maintaining the required 2,000°F temperatures for firing ceramic products.
6. The agreement deviates from filed tariffs in that the applicant will pay, in advance of construction, \$5,000, which is the estimated cost of constructing facilities to serve this customer, without allowing for one year's estimated revenue to be deducted from the advance.
7. This deviation is necessary because sales to this customer represent sales that would normally go to other customers, thus representing no additional revenue to the utility.
8. We find that this request should be granted and that the Applicant should be classified in Priority 2A under the end use criteria adopted in Decision No. 85189; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Authority be granted under the provisions of Decision No. 85189 for Southern California Gas Company to supply the requested service to The Raymond Company effective June 15, 1977.
2. The above advice letter be marked to show that it was authorized under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-2092. The effective date of this Resolution is the date hereof.
