SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Acceptance of Special Contract Under
 Conditions Deviating From Filed Tariffs

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 915-G, filed June 9, 1977, having requested authorization to carry out the terms and conditions of a special contract with Southern Pacific Industrial Development Company (Applicant) covering a gas main extension and supply of natural gas to applicant's facilities in Fremont, Alameda County, under conditions deviating from filed tariffs, and resulting in the following:

1. The agreement deviates from filed tariffs in that the Applicant will pay in advance of construction, \$26,599, which is the total estimated cost of the facilities, without allowing one year's estimated revenue to be deducted as provided by Rule No. 15.
2. The agreement further deviates from filed tariffs in that the Applicant is required to pay a cost-of-ownership fund of \$9,033, which is the present worth of annual charges of 12% per annum for five years, less the value of the facilities required to serve priority P1 applicants.
3. We find that this agreement is compensatory and nondiscriminatory and provides for service to the Applicant in such a manner as to not place a burden on other ratepayers; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Authority be granted under Sections 454 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to place this contract into effect on July 9, 1977.
2. The above advice letter and contract be marked to show that they were accepted for filing under Resolution of the State of California No. G-2105. The effective date of this Resolution is the date hereof.
