> SUBJECT: Request to Provide Additional Natural Gas Service In Excess of 50 Mcfd

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 1081, filed June 21, 1977, has requested Commission approval under the provisions of Decision No. 85189, to supply additional natural gas in excess of 50 Mcfd to Potters Industries, Inc. (Applicant) in Anaheim, Orange County under the following circumstances:

1. Applicant's request is for an additional peak day consumption of 240 Mcf, raising his existing peak day consumption from 476 Mcf to 716 Mcf.

2. Applicant will use this additional gas to operate an additional furnace to produce glass spheres for reflectorizing paint used for highway striping.

3. Experimental efforts to produce the glass spheres from finely ground glass cullet using fuel oil produced beads with dark gray surface coloration which made them unusable for the purpose intended.

4. Solar energy is not capable of producing the high temperature $(2,500^{\circ}F)$ required by this process 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

5. Applicant meets the criteria for FPC Priority 2 classification (Docket No. RP 72-6).

6. We find that this request should be granted and that the Applicant should be classified in Priority 2A under the end-use criteria adopted in Decision No. 85189; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Authority be granted under the provisions of Decision No. 85189 for Southern California Gas Company to supply the requested service to Potters Industries, Inc. effective July 21, 1977.

2. The above advice letter be marked to show that it was accepted for filing under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-2116. The effective date of this resolution is the date hereof.
