SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Acceptance of Special Contract Under Conditions Deviating from Filed Tariffs

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 927-G, filed July 11, 1977, having requested authorization to carry out the terms and conditions of a special contract with Hi-Tech Industrial Development (Applicant) covering a gas main extension and supply of natural gas to Applicant's facilities in Oakdale, Stanislaus County, under conditions deviating from filed tariffs, and resulting in the following:

- 1. The agreement deviates from filed tariffs in that the Applicant will pay in advance of construction, \$6,641, which is the estimated total cost of facilities required to serve Applicant.
- 2. The agreement further deviates from filed tariffs in that the Applicant is required to pay a cost-of-ownership fund of \$1,037, which is the present worth of annual charges of 12% per annum for five years, less the value of the facilities required to serve Priority P-1 applicants.
- 3. We find that this agreement is compensatory and nondiscriminatory and provides for service to the Applicant in such a manner as to not place a burden on other ratepayers; therefore, good cause appearing.

## IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Authority be granted under Sections 454 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to place this contract into effect on August 10, 1977.
- 2. The above advice letter and contract be marked to show that they were accepted for filing under Resolution of the State of California No. G-2127. The effective date of this Resolution is the date hereof.
