Special Contra	cts Under Conditions De	eviating From Filed Tariffs		

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 937-G, filed August 19, 1977, having requested authorization to carry out the terms and conditions of 53 separate special contracts as detailed on Attachment A (Applicants) covering gas main and/or service extensions and supply of natural gas service to the various facilities of all of the Applicants, under conditions deviating from filed tariffs, and resulting in the following:

- 1. All of the Applicants are located in or around the Penninsula-San Jose area and have gas extensions ranging in length from 14 feet to over 800 feet for a total length of 2,350 feet of gas mains and 5,389 feet of gas service extensions.
- 2. All of the Applicants for service have been classified as Priority P-1, non-residential, under the end-use criteria established by Decision No. 85189, and each will require amounts of gas service ranging from zero to 3.65 Mcfh for a total new anticipated load of 48,481 cfh.
- 3. Each of the 53 special contracts listed on the attached, deviates from filed tariffs in that each Applicant will pay in advance of construction, an amount equal to the estimated installed cost of facilities required to serve that Applicant, ranging in costs from less than \$15 to more than \$5,000 and totaling \$32,172.82 for all 53 contracts.
- 4. Because of the deterioration in the economic feasibility of new gas connections, the utility has instituted a procedure which requires Priority P-1 nonresidential applicants for gas service to pay the full estimated installed cost of facilities without credit for free-footage allowance applicable under Rule No. 15.
- 5. The utility has been submitting these special contracts to the Commission for approval on a case-by-case basis, but now requests blanket approval for these 53 similar but separate special contracts.
- 6. We find that each of these 53 contracts are compensatory and nondiscriminatory and will provide service to the Applicants in such a manner as to not place a burden on other ratepayers; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Authority be granted under Section 532 of the Public Utilities Code to place each of the 53 contracts listed on Attachment A into effect on September 18, 1977.
- 2. The above advice letter and each of the 53 contracts listed on Attachment A be marked to show that they were each accepted for filing under Resolution of the State of California No. G-2141. The effective date of this Resolution is the date hereof.
