SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Revision of Residential Rate Schedules to Provide for Winter Lifeline Usage

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY, by Advice Letter No. 1098, filed September 29, 1977, requests authority under Section 455 of the Public Utilities Code to file revised tariff sheets to provide a provision under residential rates for winter lifeline usage as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 15043-G to 15047-G, inclusive, and resulting in the following:

1. The existing rate schedules provide only for summer lifeline quantities and with the advent of the winter season as of November 1, 1977, provisions have to be made to bill customers under winter lifeline quantities.

2. The revised rate schedules do not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal or service, nor conflict with other schedules or rules and in essence provide a technical rate decrease for residential customers in that larger quantities are now available for lifeline rates.

3. We find these rate revisions to be reasonable; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Authority be granted under Section 455 of the Public Utilities Code for Southern California Gas Company to place the above tariff sheets into effect on November 1, 1977.

2. The above tariff sheets be marked to show that they were authorized under Resolution of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California No. G-2157. The effective date of this resolution is the date hereof.
