SUBJECT: Request to Classify Large Gas Fired Boilers as Priority 2A

WHEREAS: ROTH INDUSTRIES, INC. (Applicant) by letter dated February 28, 1978 has requested a deviation from the provisions of Decision Nos. 85189 and 86357 to permit classifying steam boilers using in excess of 100 Mcfd as Priority 2A at his carpet manufacturing plant in Santa Monica, Los Angeles County under the following circumstances:

- 1. Applicant presently uses 600 Mcf on a peak day to operate a gas fired, fire tube heat exchanger system to heat dye liquid in its carpet dying vats. This use is classified as Priority 2A under the criteria established by Decision No. 85189.
- 2. Applicant proposes to discontinue this method and substitute a steam injection system supplied by a new boiler plant at a cost of \$250,000. Boiler end-use under 750 Mcfd is classified as Priority 3 under the criteria established by Decision No. 86357.
- 3. Applicant claims that the proposed steam injection system will conserve 45% of present gas consumption per unit of production.

WHEREAS: We find that:

- 1. The converted gas usage would be classified in Priority 3 under Decision No. 86357.
- 2. Other similar industrial gas users are classified as Priority 3 and the Applicant will be in the same priority as other carpet manufacturers with the same gas using equipment; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Commission approval be denied to ROTH INDUSTRIES, INC. request to classify the proposed steam boilers in Priority 2A.
