SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Gas Service Mutual Assistance Agreement

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY (PG&E) AND SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY (SoCal) have entered into a Gas Service Mutual Assistance Agreement in compliance with Ordering Paragraph 10 of Decision No. 89177, dated July 31, 1978, under the following major provisions:

1. Delivery of natural gas from one party's system to protect P1/P2A service in the other party's system to the extent that such deliveries can be accomplished without jeopardizing the P1/P2A service on the delivering utility's system.
2. Delivery of gas otherwise available for P5 service on one party's system to protect P2B/P3/P4 service on the other party's system.
3. The supplying utility is entitled to request return of P1/P2A protection gas to the extent that the receiving utility subsequently has gas available in excess of its P1/P2A requirements.
4. The supplying utility is entitled to request return of P2B/P3/P4 protection gas to the extent that the receiving utility subsequently has gas available in excess of its P1 through P4 requirements.
5. The price of P1/P2A and P2B/P3/P4 protection gas per million Btu (MMBtu) is set at the supplying utility's highest cost increment of supply (including transportation, if applicable to the supplying party's system) on the day protection gas is provided plus a transportation fee of 10 cents per million Btu. If the volume of gas delivered on a particular day exceeds the volume of gas available to the supplying utility from its highest cost increment the next highest cost increment shall apply to the extent necessary. The price to be paid for return gas by the receiving utility shall be the price at which the protection gas was delivered less the 10 cents per Mcf transportation fee.
6. All gas costs and related expenses are to be included in each utility's respective gas cost adjustment clause.

WHEREAS: We find that the subject agreement meets the intent of Decision No. 89177; therefore good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

Pacific Gas and Electric Company and Southern California Gas Company are authorized to carry out the terms and conditions of the Gas Service Mutual Assistance Agreement submitted by letter of April 13, 1979.

The effective date of this Resolution is the date hereof.
