SUBJECT: C. P. National. Order Authorizing Rate Increase Applicable to Needles Rate Area to Track Pacific Gas & Electric Company Resulting in Total Annual Revenue Increase of \$76,640 or 15.8%

WHEREAS: C.P. NATIONAL (CPN), by Advice Letter No. 138-G, filed November 8, 1979, requests authority to file revised tariff schedules, applicable to its Needles Rate Area in order to track a rate increase from its supplier, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 692-G to 696-G, inclusive, under the following conditions:

- l. The proposed rate increases of 6.050 cents per therm for all lifeline rates and 8.338 cents per therm for all non-lifeline rates, will result in an annual revenue increase of \$76,640, which will offset a PG&E rate increase as filed by Advice Letter No. 1057-G in accordance with Decision No. 90935, dated October 23, 1979.
- 2. Part of this rate increase is applied to lifeline rates because the differential between lifeline and non-lifeline rates has exceeded 25% and this procedure has previously been approved by Commission Resolution Nos. G-2306 and G-2318.
- 3. A comparison of the present and proposed rates for metered gas service is set below:
