SUBJECT:

Southwest Gas Corporation. Order Authorizing PGA Rate Increase, Applicable to San Bernardino County Rate Area, Resulting in Annual Revenue Increase of \$371,000 or 1.6%.

WHEREAS: SOUTHWEST GAS CORPORATION (SoWest), by Advice Letter No. 252, Supplemental, filed February 10, 1981, has requested authority to file revised tariff schedules, applicable to its San Bernardino County Rate Area, in order to track increased cost of gas from its supplier, Pacific Gas & Electric Company (PG&E), as set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 2031-G to 2041-G, inclusive, under the following conditions:

- 1. The proposed rate increases of 0.66 cents per therm for Tier I rates (lifeline), 0.73 cents per therm for Tier II rates and 1.05 cents per therm for Tier III rates, are to offset the cost of gas from PG&E as filed by Advice Letter No. 1139-G in accordance with the provisions of Decision No. 92656, dated February 4, 1981, in Application No. 59902.
- 2. The results of the rate revisions will be an annual revenue increase of \$371,000, or an average of 0.72 cents per therm for all sales.
- 3. This proposed rate structure sets the Tier II rates at the average increase per therm sold, with the Tier I rates set at 90% of Tier II and the balance of the increase spread across the Tier III rates.
- 4. A comparison of the present and proposed rates for metered gas service is set below:
