6.3 PUBLIC INFORMATION PROGRAM

The California Public Utilities Commission conducted an extensive outreach program to inform agencies and the general public about the proposed project, the environmental review process, and schedule and to opportunities for public involvement.

6.3.1 NOTICING

In compliance with CEQA guidelines, the CPUC, as the lead agency, prepared a Notice of Preparation (NOP), which was mailed on February 17, 1999, to state, local, federal, trustee, and responsible agencies affected by the project. A copy of the NOP was posted for public review in the Stockton-San Joaquin Public Library, Lodi Public Library, and Isleton Public Library.

In preparation for the Draft EIR, the CPUC sent a notice of public scoping meetings to more than 650 stakeholders, including special interest groups, and local, regional, and state governmental office holders and agencies and residents and landowners up to 300 feet on either side of the project area.

Advertisements announcing the public meetings were placed in multiple papers throughout the geographic area of the project. The display advertisements were posted between the dates of February 26, 1999, and March 7, 1999.

6.3.2 PUBLIC MEETINGS

The CPUC conducted two public scoping meetings to explain the environmental review process and to receive public comment on the scope of the Environmental Impact Report (EIR). These were conducted in the project area. On March 8, 1999, approximately 150 individuals attended a public meeting at Hutchins Street Square in Lodi. On March 9, 1999, approximately 40 individuals attended a public meeting at the Isleton Community Center in Isleton.
