



This KOP is located at the equestrian center within Chino Hills State Park. The Horse Camp is located on a hilltop at the southern end of Bane Canyon Road. Foreground and middleground features include rolling, undeveloped hills covered with native grasses and non-native mustard, which, when in bloom, is very scenic. Small clumps of dark green brush and trees are scattered across the hillsides. Existing 220-kV double circuit and 500-kV single circuit transmission lines are very visible on the skyline ridges. Corrals draw attention to the immediate foreground features. Paved roads and the restroom of the camping area are visible in the middleground.

Overall Visual Sensitivity: high. For visitors to Chino Hills State Park in general and KOP-South-24 specifically, the high viewer exposure, high viewer concern, and high visual quality lead to a high overall visual sensitivity of the visual setting and viewing characteristics.
