Dear Ms. Chan:

This refers to your letter dated May 22, 2012, requesting a time extension to complete the alteration of the existing at-grade crossing of the Union Pacific Railroad Company (UPRR) Los Angeles Subdivision tracks and Workman Mill Road in the City of Industry (City), Los Angeles County. The crossing is identified as CPUC No. 003-13.90, and DOT No. 811063U. The City and UPRR provided concurrence by letter to the Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts (LACSD) for the time extension request.

The Commission's Rail Crossings Engineering Section (RCES) Staff investigated the request by LACSD and finds that there has been no substantial change in circumstances since the granting of the original and amended authority. Since the City of Industry and UPRR are in agreement and have no objection to the requested time extension, you may proceed with the alterations as previously authorized by the Commission on June 10, 2010 with a two-year time extension. This authorization shall expire on June 10, 2014.

In all other respects the original authorization for improvements remains in full force and effect.
