Dear Mr. Emigh:

This refers to your letter dated June 25, 2012, received by us on June 28, 2012, requesting authorization, pursuant to California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) General Order (GO) 88-B, to alter the Market Avenue at-grade highway-rail crossing of the Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) track in the County of Contra Costa (County). The crossing is identified as CPUC Crossing No. 001A-13.60 and DOT No. 751692P.

In light of the unexpected finding of a PG&E gas transmission line at the proposed location of the Commission Standard 9-A (flashing light signal assembly with automatic gate arm and additional flashing light signals over the roadway on a cantilevered arm) warning device, the County is unable to continue with the design as submitted with GO 88-B request G.12-06-019. The Commission's Rail Crossing Engineering Section (RCES) staff met with the County and UPRR on July 17, 2012 and agreed to an alternative design which will relocate the Commission Standard 9-A warning device and place the sidewalk in front of the Commission Standard 9-A warning device. All other aspects of the design remain the same. RCES staff requested the County submit a new GO 88-B request with the alternative design. RCES staff therefore dismisses the GO 88-B request G.12-06-019 without granting authorization to construct and awaits for the new GO 88-B request with the alternative design to be submitted.
