Re: Time Extension Request for G.10-09-019, G.10-09-020, and G.10-07-020 to Modify the Norwalk Boulevard, Los Nietos Road, and Pioneer Boulevard At-Grade Highway-Rail Crossings, respectively, in City of Santa Fe Springs, Los Angeles County.

Dear Mr. Thomas:

This refers to your letter dated March 29, 2013, requesting a time extension to complete the alteration of three at-grade crossings of the BNSF Railway Company's (BNSF) San Bernardino Subdivision tracks across Norwalk Boulevard, Los Nietos Road, and Pioneer Boulevard in the City of Santa Fe Springs (City), Los Angeles County. The crossings are identified in the table below:

The City and BNSF provided concurrence by email attached to your time extension request.

The California Public Utilities Commission's (Commission) Rail Crossings Engineering Section (RCES) Staff investigated the request by BNSF and finds that there has been no substantial change in circumstances since the granting of the original authorizations for each crossing. The original authorizations were for a two-year period and have since expired. However, since the authorizations took place just prior to a RCES policy change that now grants authorizations for a three-year period, RCES will, considering these specific circumstances, extend the expired authorizations.

Since the City and BNSF are in agreement and have no objection to the requested time extension, you may proceed with the alterations as previously authorized by the Commission on October 28,

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2010 and August 24, 2010 with a two-year time extension. The authorization for all three crossings shall expire on May 3, 2015.

In all other respects the original authorization for improvements remains in full force and effect.

Within 30 days after completion of this project, City shall notify RCES that the authorized work is completed, by submitting a completed Commission Standard Form G title *Report of Changes at Highway Grade Crossings and Separation*.
